OUR LADY OF THE ASSUMPTION PARISH PRIMARY SCHOOL

The new Community Hub at Our Lady of the Assumption Primary School in Cheltenham, Victoria, reimagines existing spaces, striving to live out the school's Vision to be a place of welcome, with pride in creating a wonderful community spirit. The success of the new building allows each member of the learning community to feel a strong sense of belonging at the heart of the school.

The newly formed community room, expanded library, and STEM Centre combine to support the school's philosophy of fostering the skills and talents of all students, bringing families into partnership with their children in the learning process. The enlarged library space improves the functionality and quality of the learning facilities for students and families to share and reinforce the school's 'love of reading'.

The reclaiming of a narrow strip of outdoor found space between the library and the adjacent multi-purpose hall provides an extension of the library, and a place for quiet reading and reflection. The mural presented is a celebration of OLA Cheltenham focussing on the strong connection between education, community values, and Catholic identity. The design is a collaboration of images drawn by the children and the artist. The image is vibrant and fun whilst adorning a calm green background that ties into the colour scheme of the new building. The red line running through the piece links the images representing the interconnectedness and unity within the school community.
